Walton Common (Dave Horlick)

Doesn't time fly! The main wildlife 'season' is already winding down and we are busy preparing for 2018 with hay cuts and the like.

Last winter our efforts concentrated around exposing the archaeological features, making sure that any dangerous trees were made safe and trying to control invasive trees such as Turkey Oaks and Holm Oaks. This winter we will continue work on expanding the grassland areas with some selective felling and thinning of trees that have encroached over time. We also hope to make some improvements to the lower path by widening it in places and introducing some open 'bays'.

By the time you read this, the final guided walk of the year will have taken place. I have thoroughly enjoyed meeting people on these little walks. It has provided the opportunity to ask questions about the reserve, its wildlife and its history ... and I hope I have managed to answer a few of them. All being well, I will continue them again next year.

Parish Council (Don Hill)

The Parish Council met on 11th September, after a 'summer break' during August. As usual during the summer period, things have tended to be quiet.

Policing: We were lucky to have a visit from PC Jen Clarke, our Police Beat Officer. One of the policing economies of recent years is that Police no longer attend Parish Council meetings as a matter of routine, but Jen has always been first class at keeping us in touch. She could tell us that there has been no recent reported crime in the Parish. Speeding and SpeedWatch issues were discussed, as well as the proposed Walton Street 20mph speed limit, which is still under review with North Somerset Council. Following complaints of noisy, speeding bikers on their way to Weston-super-Mare on Thursday evenings, the Clerk complained to the Weston Bike Night organisers. Their response was positive, but it will be next Spring before their influence on the speeding element of their Thursday evening fraternity can be judged, as the meets in WsM are only held during spring and summer.

Lorraine Field: In view of concerns about levels, the application paperwork for 14 new pitches on Lorraine Filed was reviewed by members. It appears that site levels on this new application are virtually identical to those on the original one. Whatever was on the drawings, this point was not made clear in the supporting application notes and it has led to a lot of very justified concerns. We understand the site will be re-profiled, to take it back to the original levels and adherence to the original levels will need to be checked by NSC as construction ensues. Our ward Councillor, Nigel Ashton, is monitoring the progress and outcomes.

Broadband: Now that we know Gigaclear have been appointed as installation contractors for our area, we are expecting to learn, over the next few weeks, what the fast-broadband expectations might be for those households who receive their broadband via Clevedon. Doesn't this bright, technological world move fast!

Gardening Club (Alison Stott)

At the September meeting we talked about various gardens members had visited over the Summer including Highgrove. Another local garden open under the National Garden Scheme, which several of us visited, inspired us with its variety, both in the different areas and in the planting. Flowers brought from members' gardens were admired, in particular the beautiful dahlias from Anne and Colin's garden and especially the large pinky-apricot coloured Dahlia "Labyrinth". Having been out of fashion for years, these large-headed dahlias with their vibrant colours are now back in favour and look wonderful in the borders.
