

Walton-in-Gordano Parish Council

At a meeting of the Parish Council held on Wednesday 6th June 1973, at the Village Hall.

Present

Messrs. G.R. Brodie (Chairman) A.T. Gole, K.J. Dilley, R. Knight, the retiring clerk Mr. G.T. Russell and the incoming clerk, Mrs. B.S. Cannell. Apologies from Sir William Miles, Bt.

Minutes

The minutes of the last meeting were read, confirmed and signed.

Bus SERVICES

The clerk (G.T.H. Russell) read a letter from the R.D.C. dated 14th May 1973 regarding the Rural Bus Service 360, Clevedon to Portishead. The Council noted that the improved timings related specifically to the needs of people travelling to Portishead and made no extra provision for those wishing to use the facilities at Clevedon.

It was proposed by Mr Gole and seconded by Mr. Dilley that the clerk be instructed to write a letter to the R.D.C. stating the dissatisfaction of the Parish Council with the proposed revision of timetables. Mr. Knight suggested that it should be put to the R.D.C. that an early morning bus could run to Clevedon instead of Portishead on Tuesdays and Thursdays. This was agreed.

PLANNING

PERMISSION

Mr. Dilley drew attention to the fact that a planning application, concerning a Garden Centre, in the village had not been put before the Parish Council.

It was proposed by Mr Dilley and seconded by Mr Knight that the Parish Council should, in future, be informed of all matters relating to such planning applications. This was agreed.

COUNCIL
MEETINGS

It was proposed by Mr. Dilley and seconded by Mr. Knight that the Parish Council should hold regular meetings and that the newly-elected Woodspring district councillors should be invited to attend such meetings. This was agreed.

STATE OF
ROADS

Mr. Brodie stated that part of the main road, in the centre of the village was in a bad state of repair, after gas workings had taken place. He also stated that the briar hedge, at the top of Moor Lane, was in urgent need of cutting.

It was proposed by Mr. Brodie and seconded by Mr. Dilley that the clerk be instructed to write to Somerset C.C. in this connection. (Mr Naylor). This was agreed.

RETIREMENT OF CHAIRMAN AND CLERK Mr. Dilley expressed the Council's appreciation and thanks to the Chairman Mr. G. R. Brodie and the clerk Mr. G. T. H. Russell on their retirement from office, after twenty one and twenty years of service respectively.

SIGNPOSTS.

The clerk stated that the five public footpath signs had been delivered. A decision was made to erect the signs on Monday 18th June.

It was proposed, by Mr. Dilley and seconded by Mr. Russell, that a further letter should be written by the clerk, requesting a reply to her letter of 9th June 1973 on this matter. This was agreed.

STATE OF ROADS

The clerk read a letter from the County Surveyor, dated 14th June 1973 which was in reply to her letter of 9th June in this connection, in which he stated that he was unable to take any action regarding the state of the road in the village and the hedges in Moor Lane.

ANY OTHER

BUSINESS It was proposed by Mr. Dilley and seconded by Mr. Knights that the clerk be instructed to write a further letter to S.C.C. regarding the proposed weight restriction on the Coast Road, giving the alternative route a Valley Road. This was agreed.

It was proposed by Mr Dilley and seconded by Mr. Russell that arrangements be made for the holding of regular Council Meetings and that the two Woodspurig District Councillors (Mr H. Riddiford and Mr. G. Barker) be informed of the dates of proposed meetings and requested to attend as frequently as possible. Mr Knights suggested that these meetings should be held approximately every six weeks, on the first and third Mondays of the appropriate months alternately. This was agreed. These meetings are to be held in the Village Hall at 7.30. pm.

BUSES

It was proposed by Mr. Dilley and seconded by Mr. Russell that the clerk should write a further letter to the R.D.C. regarding the bus services. This was agreed.

MARINERS

PATH It was proposed by Mr Cole and seconded by Mr Dilley that the clerk write a letter to the R.D.C. requesting that Mairies Path should be cut back as soon as possible as it could not be used in its present state. This was agreed.

Mr Cole suggested that the R.D.C. should be asked to cut back the path in mid-June in future, instead of July.

It was stated that the paths for which the R.D.C. are responsible were generally in a bad state. A request was made that the R.D.C. be asked to consider the provision of hand rails at certain points on Main's Path, as it was thought there was some danger, particularly to children.

SIGN POSTS

It was decided to order two litter posts and four signs, when additional finance becomes available. Mr Russell stated that the August precept will be £50.

VERGES

It was proposed by Mr Cole and seconded by Mr Russell that a letter be sent to the S.C.C. Surveyor's Department requesting that the verges for which they are responsible be cut, and that a letter should also be sent to Sir William Miles requesting that his tenants be asked to cut back the bushes and bracken growing through from the golf course to the roadway. This was agreed.

ERCTION

It was decided to erect signs on Tuesday 3rd July.

Walton-a-Gordano Parish Council

At a meeting of the Parish Council held on Monday 26th August 1973, at the Village Hall.

PRESENT Messrs. A.T. Cole, K.J. Dilley, R. Knight, C.T.H. Russell and the clerk Mrs B.S. Cannell. Also present Mr. H. Riddiford in his capacity as Woodspring District Councillor. Apologies from Sir William Miles St. and Mr. G. Barker.

MINUTES The minutes of the last meeting were read, confirmed and signed.

CORRESPONDENCE

BUS SERVICES. The clerk read two letters from the R.D.C. in this connection, dated 11.7.73 and 2.8.73. The first letter was a review of the circumstances leading up to the present proposed timetable of Service 360. The second letter stated that at a meeting of the Highways and Transport Committee held on it was resolved that no further action be taken at present.

It was decided that the clerk be instructed to write a further letter to the R.D.C. stating the dissatisfaction of the Parish Council regarding this matter. Reference to be made to the subsidy for the service by the S.C.C.

PATAS AND HIGHWAYS The clerk read a letter ^{dated 11.2.73.} from the County Divisional Surveyor regarding the cutting of Rights of Way. He stated that cutting of Maurice's Path had been in progress for some time, but that it was impossible to cut all the Rights of Way because of shortage of labour and other factors.

The Parish Council decided that whilst this was appreciated a further letter should be written in view of the potential danger. Mr Cole offered to 'walk the path' with the County Surveyor if he cared to see the state of the path for himself.

Briars and Bracken from Golf Course The clerk read a letter from Sir William Miles Bt. dated 28th July 1973 explaining his position regarding this matter. As the result of a gift of the land in question by his father, Sir Charles Miles Bt., to the County Council, they are responsible, in perpetuity, for the repair and maintenance of the iron fence between the Golf Course and the road. In the view of Sir William Miles this responsibility also covers trimming back the undergrowth on the road side of the fence.

It was decided that a letter be written to the secretary of the Golf Club requesting them to cut back the overgrown briars and brambles.

Lowes and the Environment The clerk read two letters from the R.D.C. dated 10th July and 15th August regarding a proposed weight restriction order on the Coast Road. Their most recent letter stated that the Council's Highway and Transport Committee resolved to support a recommendation that a 3 ton Weight Restriction Order, except for access, be made for the Coast Road from Walton Green Tree to the junction with Valley Road.

It was decided that a letter of thanks should be sent to the R.D.C. in this connection, expressing the hope that they will endeavour to obtain ratification of this resolution by the Council as soon as possible.

Any Other Business The clerk referred to a telephone conversation with Miss Sawden (Clerk of Weston-in-C. and North Weston Parish Councils) with regard to a Consultative Committee set up^{jointly} by several Parish Councils concerned with the Environment (with special reference to tipping).

Environment It was proposed by Mr Dilley and seconded by Mr Russell that Mr Cole and Mr Knight should attend meetings in this connection on behalf of the Parish Council. This was agreed.

Brook Moor Lane It was stated by Mr Knight that the R.D.C. had cut back the brook banks, opposite 'Brookside' in Moor Lane, and that the cuttings had been left to fall into the brook, thereby giving rise to possible danger of flooding. It was decided that a letter be sent to the Highways Department concerning this matter.

Drains and gutters Mr Cole drew attention to the fact that many of the drains and gutters in the village are blocked. It was decided that this matter should ^{also} be brought to the attention of the Highways Department.

Provision of receptacles for stones It was decided that the Highways Department be asked to provide a receptacle for the salted stones which are usually provided in preparation for winter use. It was thought that this would save wastage and avoid littering the road, which has happened in the past. The clerk was instructed to write a letter to this effect.

Dissatisfaction with state of village The clerk was instructed to inform the Highways Department of the dissatisfaction of the Parish Council with regard to the general state of the village and to state that unless some action is taken they will have to refer the matter to the S.C.C. representative for the Gordano Valley.

At a meeting of the Parish Council, held on Monday 14th January 1974, at the Village Hall.

Present.

Messes. A.J. Cole (Chairman), K. Dilley, R. Knight, C. Dunn and G.T.H. Russell and the clerk Ms. B.S. Gaskell.

Minutes

The minutes of the last meeting were read, confirmed and signed, by the Chairman.

Correspondence The clerk read a letter from the Somerset Association of Parish Councils re. Affiliation Fees.

Somerset Association of Parish Councils It was decided that the fee of £4.20, for the year 1973-4 should be paid.

There was some discussion of the Associations arrangements for a course for Parish Council Clerks. In view of the size of the Parish it was decided that there was insufficient justification for the expenditure of £15 for attendance at such a course.

The Fuel Crisis

Letters had been received, from L.A. RDC dated 30th November and the Dept. of the Environment dated 6th Dec. 1973 regarding the conservation of electricity supplies on highways. It was decided that there was no action to be taken by the Parish Council.

Proposed Corder Beadle

A letter was read, by the clerk, in reply to the Council's letter of 21st November 1973, in this connection. The letter confirmed that planning permission for the use of the land in question, as a Corder Beadle, had been refused, but stated that the land may be used on the basis of its previous use, in growing crops. However such use may not

include "development as a retail centre for the sale of sundry garden items---which are not specifically related to the growing of crops on that particular acre of land."

Public Paths

A letter from the Ramblers' Association was read by the clerk. This led to some discussion regarding the local signposting and waymarking programme. It was decided to purchase one post and two signs in addition to those already erected. The clerk was instructed to order these from Superiore, as before, when the next precept has been paid.

It was brought to the notice of the Parish Council, that one of the posts, erected adjacent to the property of Mr Young, had been removed and re-erected in another position.

It was thought that the new position would, in any case, be near that the sign would be re-grown during the summer months. It was decided that Sir William Hale be approached regarding this matter. Mr. Cole agreed to deal with the matter.

Conservation Areas The clerk read a letter from Somerset County Council, dated 17th December 1973, in this connection. It stated that Walton-in-Gordano is on the list for future consideration by the new County or District Council. It was regretted that it was unlikely that any further action would be taken by S.C.C.

Somerset Social Service Dept.

A letter was read, from this dept., in connection with co-ordinating the help of members of the community who may be at risk during the fuel crisis.

There was considerable discussion regarding this matter. The Council reached the conclusion that most members of the village community were catered for, as they were in regular touch with family or neighbours. However it was decided that this was a good opportunity to check that all the old folk were receiving all the help and allowances to which they are entitled. The clerk was instructed to write to the Social Service Department to seek its help in this connection.

Planning Applications The clerk read a letter from the Director of Planning, Wardspring requesting information regarding the wishes of the Parish Council with regard to the nature of the planning application details it wished to receive. It was decided that the Parish Council required details of all planning applications in the village and a general list of applications in the Gordano Valley Area.

Amalgamation The clerk read a letter from Miss of the Sander (North Weston Parish Council) in this connection, in which the Council was requested to nominate a delegate to attend a meeting to consider the possible amalgamation of the Gordano Valley Parish Councils. The Parish Council was unanimously opposed to the idea, but Mr Cole agreed to attend the meeting on behalf of the Council, "as an observer, not as a member of the working party".

Precept The clerk was instructed to request a

Precept of £70.00 for the financial year
ending 31st March 1975.

Rural Bus Services A letter from Paul Dean (M.P.) was read. This was concerned with the supplementing of public services by locally organised private services. This is made possible because of the removal of restrictions regarding payment from passengers.

Local Govt. Boundary Commission Report. A letter and copy of the report was made available.

Planning Applications

The reports of the Surveyor and Area Planning Office for the following date were available for inspection.

Any Other Business

Mr. Dilley stated that Sir. William Miles had drawn his attention to the dumping of rubbish in Moor Lane (possibly electrical goods). Other Councillors had also noticed this and the clerk was instructed to write to the R.D.C. in this connection.

Mr. Dilley also stated that there had been many complaints from villagers about the scattering of stones over the road, by the tree. The clerk was instructed to write to the R.D.C. regarding this matter and to request that the stones be placed in the "pill box", which it is understood is owned by the Council (RDC). The clerk was also instructed to inform

the RDC that water is not draining away fifty yards from Mr Watts farm ('Dow Farm') on the left hand side of the road going towards Portishead.

Mr Knight drew the attention of the Council to the state of the ditch opposite 'Brookside' in Moor Lane. A request for the ditch to be cleared was to be included in the clerk's letter.

After some discussion it was decided to request the R.D.C. to provide a fire hydrant in the lower part of the village. The Parish Council instructed the clerk to write to the RDC in this connection, pointing out that a main had been laid to properties in the village.

The meeting closed at 9.30 pm.

National Energy Crisis - Disconnection of Street lighting. 17.1.74.

After some considerable discussion of the matter it was decided that since the W.-U.-C. Parish Council was not in favour of such an amalgamation there was no point in the Chairman (Mr. A. T. Gole) attending any further meetings. It was agreed that consideration of any such proposals be put to parishioners at a Parish Meeting later in the year.

Audit A letter from Woodspring District Council stated that the District Auditor had been appointed as the Council's Auditor and will audit the accounts of our Parish Council.

The clerk stated that she had replied to letters requesting information regarding Parish Recreation and Sport facilities and the circulation of local magazines.

Woodspring District Council - Planning Applications - Public Participation

The clerk read a letter dated 25th January in this connection and stated that, with the Chairman's authority she had written to request that plans be put on deposit at the Clevedon Council Offices.

S.C.C. Social Services Department.

A letter from Mr. J. Le Gue, Social Worker at the (Clevedon) Divisional Office stated that he had visited Mrs. Cusson and her brother Mr. Bassett

and found them in a very poor financial position.
He had arranged for them to obtain an Attendance Allowance and was intending to give any further assistance which may be required. The ^{stated that the} clerk had written a letter of thanks to Mr. Le Gue.

Any Other Business

G.P.O.

Mr Dilley stated that the filling in of treechip after work by the G.P.O. was not completed satisfactorily. The clerk was instructed to contact the G.P.O. regarding this matter.

SIGNPOSTS

Mr. Cole reported that he had dealt with this matter and ^{that} the signpost would be re-erected on the wall of "Aunswere".

FLOODING IN THE VILLAGE

There was considerable discussion regarding the recent flooding of certain areas in the village. The clerk was instructed to write to the County Surveyor stating that the parish of Monk is evidently flooded from Church Farm to Cross Tree causing severe flooding and to request that the parish stones be lifted in order that the track may be cleared. Mr Dilley dues the

attention of councillors to the fact that little assistance had been given to Mr and Mrs. Hart when their shop was flooded.

DAMAGE BY LORRY. The clerk was instructed to inform the R.D.C. that damage had been caused by a lorry outside Rectory Farm. This had resulted in part of the roof of the truck carrying it.

STATE OF THE VILLAGE. Mr Dilley drew attention once again to the poor state of the village. He wondered if it would be desirable to make efforts to improve this state without the help of the R.D.C. It was decided that if this was done the R.D.C. would probably abrogate responsibility for such work in the future.

PROPOSED PLAY AREA. At the request of Mrs. Gaskell it was proposed by Mr. R. Knight that some consideration be given to the provision of a play area in the village. Mr Cole seconded this proposal which was also greeted with enthusiasm by others in attendance.

There was some considerable discussion regarding the matter and Mr Cole agreed to approach Sir William Miles regarding the possible use of the old 'pond' for this purpose. Councillors ^{stated} decided that they would be prepared to make suitable equipment for such a play area themselves.

It was agreed that the next meeting be held on Monday 8th April. The meeting closed at 9.20 p.m.
