At a meeting of the Parish Council held on Monday 8th April 1974, at the Village Hall.

PRESENT

Messrs. A.J. Cole (Chairman), R. Knight, C.T. Russell, C. Dune and the clerk (Mrs. B.S. Garsell).

An apology for absence was received from Mr. K. Dilley.

MINUTES. The minutes were read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

CORRESPONDENCE AND MATTERS ARISING

1. Water supply and provision of fire hydrant in the lower part of the village.

The clerk read a letter dated 1.3.74. from the Divisional Commander of the Fire Brigade, in this connection, in which he offered to meet councillors again to discuss the matter further. It was proposed by Mr Cole and seconded by Mr Dune that Cndr. Hayman be invited to attend a meeting in the near future. It was also proposed by Mr. Cole, and seconded by Mr Russell that Mr. Brian Lewis, Avon County Councillor be invited to attend the said meeting in his capacity as member of the River Board. ^{This was agreed and} The clerk was instructed to write to Cndr. Hayman and Mr. Lewis accordingly.

Also in this connection the clerk was instructed to contact Mr. Hoy, of the Internal Drainage Board, regarding responsibility for the water from the spring and to request that the Bristol Waterworks Co. make available, to the Parish Council, a map showing the water supplies within the parish boundaries.

2. State of the Village.

A letter from the new County Surveyor (Mr. J. Penn) was read by the clerk. This was in reply to her letter of 28th February. The Chairman stated that

Any Other Business

1. It was proposed by Mr Cole and seconded by Mr. Russell that a request be sent to Woodspur D.C. for a 'No Tipping' notice to be erected in an appropriate position in Moor Lane. This was agreed.
2. Mr. Dunn raised the question of the provision of a Village Notice Board. Mr. Russell agreed to approach the church authorities regarding the possible erection of a noticeboard at St. Paul's church.
3. Mr Cole drew the Council's attention to the raising of a stile by Mr. Brodie. After some discussion it was agreed that, if this was necessary in order to retain cattle a suitable step be provided to enable parishioners to negotiate the stile. Mr Cole offered to approach Mr Brodie with regard to this matter.
4. Mr Cole also agreed to ensure that a notice concerning the Easter relief collection be displayed in the village shop and that copies of the booklet

"Your handy guide to Council services," be made available to parishioners using the village shop.

5. Mr Cole reported that he had dealt with the matter of the C.P.O. work on the coast road.
6. The clerk was requested to establish whether or not Mr Dilley had managed to make any progress in the matter of the proposed use of the old 'pound' as a children's play area.

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PRECEPT.


The precept for £70 was signed by the Chairman and two other councillors. Glegues also signed, for S.W.E.B. and the clerk.

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7. The clerk reported that she had received a telephone call from Mr. Brian Lewis, the new Avon County Councillor, stating his wish to participate in any parish meetings in which it was thought he could play a useful part. He requested the clerk to send him notification and agenda of Parish Council meetings.

It was agreed that the next meeting be held on Monday 20th May at 7.30 p.m. The meeting closed at 9.40 p.m.

This was the first meeting held since the parish became part of the County of Avon and since Woodspring took over as the new District Council on 1st April 1974.

Walton-in-Gordano Parish Council

At a meeting of the Parish Council held on Monday 20th May 1974, at the Village Hall.

PRESENT

Messrs. A.J. Cole (Chairman) R. Knight, K. Dilley, G.T.H. Russell and C. Dunn and the clerk Mrs. B.S. Cannell. Mr. Haynes, Divisional Commander of the Fire Brigade was also present.

MINUTES

The minutes were read, confirmed and signed, by the Chairman, Mr. A.J. Cole.

DISCUSSION WITH FIRE OFFICER

Mr. Haynes answered questions put by councillors regarding the question of the possibility of a fire hydrant being installed in the lower part of the village.

There was considerable discussion regarding this matter, but the outcome was that, as far as the Fire Brigade is concerned the position is the same as in 1969. Mr. Haynes stated that the additional supplies referred to were connected to a 2" main. He noted two new sources of emergency water supply 1) Hackwood House swimming pool 2) lake reservoir on golf course and agreed to supply councillors with copies of the amended map.

He also noted that during the summer months there is a considerably reduced flow of water in the stream used for pumping on a previous occasion.

Mr. Haynes was pressed by councillors to assure them that he felt confident that the water supply at his disposal would meet his requirements in the event of a fire in the village. This assurance was given, but Mr. Haynes offered to put his confidence to

the test by laying on a further practical demonstration aimed to show that the slightly changed circumstances would not decrease the efficiency of an emergency fire-fighting operation. It was agreed to set a convenient date and location for the exercise at the Parish Council meeting to be held on Monday 1st July 1974.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

Mr. Bright asked if any further action had been taken regarding the matter of Mr Brodie's stile. Mr Cole stated that the action taken was not really satisfactory. It was proposed by Mr. Duse and seconded by Mr Cole that a letter be written to Mr. Brodie regarding this matter. This was agreed.

CORRESPONDENCE AND MATTERS ARISING.

- 23.4.74. The clerk read a letter from Mr. Penne, the County
 Divisional Surveyor, which stated that he was

investigating the Parish Council's request for a 'No Tipping' sign to be erected in Moor Lane.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

MARINERS PATH The clerk drew the attention of the P.C. to the fact that the last letter regarding the investigation into the cost of providing fencing for the path was 17th Oct. 1973 and that the last letter concerning the proposed Weight Restriction Order was from Mr. Evans, dated 11th Jan. 1974.

Mr Dilley proposed and Mr Knight seconded that further letters be sent by the clerk in this connection. This was agreed.

AVON L.C.C. ASSOCIATION It was proposed by Mr. Cole and seconded by Mr Russell that the Parish Council should seek membership of the Avon Local Councils Association. The motion was carried.

CLERK'S HONORARIUM It was proposed by Mr. Cole and seconded by Mr Russell that the clerk's honorarium be increased from £5.25 per annum to £20 per annum. This motion was carried.

V.A.T. Mr. Cole pointed out that the P.C. was entitled to claim repayment of V.A.T. on certain items.

SOCIAL SERVICES Mr. Cole reported that Mr Bessant was now a recipient of £6.10s. a week as a result of the P. Council's efforts in co-operation with the Social Services department. This seemed very satisfactory.

PROPOSED CHILDREN'S PLAY SPACE

It was reported, by Mr Dilley, that Sir

William Miles was not in favour of the old pound being used for this purpose. There was some discussion regarding the possibility of using a space at the rear of Mr. Blake's garden. It was proposed by Mr. Cole and seconded by Mr. Durr that Mr. Dilley be asked to approach Sir William initially, to obtain his permission before any appeal be made to Mr. Blake. This was agreed.

FOOTPATHS. Mr. Russell stated that Mr. Woodman had agreed to cut the footpaths as before at a fee of £20.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING.

It was agreed that a meeting be held at 8 pm at the Village Hall on Thursday 30th May 1974. (This was later amended to 29th May.) Mr. Dilley agreed to see that notices were printed to this effect and Mr. Cole agreed to see that they were displayed in a prominent position. (Seven days notice is statutorily required and the Parish Meeting must be held annually between 1st March and 1st June.) It was agreed that Mr. Brian Lewis, Avoe County Councillor, be invited to attend, if possible. Mr. Barnes the Woodspur District Treasurer. This was in view of the likelihood of there being considerable public concern over the massive increase in rates to be levied by Woodspur District Council for the year 1974/5.


PROTEST AT RATES LEVY

The clerk was instructed to write to Mr. Paul Dear M.P. and to Woodspur District and Avoe County Councils expressing

the Parish Council's extreme concern at the massive increase in the rates to be levied for the year 1974/5 and in particular to protest at the imposition of a water rate of 8.34 p in the pound on behalf of the Wessex Water Authority. When there is no main drainage in the village and parishioners have to pay to have their cess pits emptied.

It was thought, by the Parish Council, that permission to hold such a demonstration should first be sought from Sir William Miles - the clerk was instructed accordingly.

WATER

SUPPLY

Mr. Dilley drew the Parish Council's attention to the present low level of water in Walton Brook, the main source of water for fire-fighting purposes. After some discussion regarding this matter the clerk was instructed to write to the Wessex Water Authority, at Bridgewater, to seek further information regarding responsibility for ~~water supplies in the Parish~~ Walton Brook in the Parish.

THE VILLAGE

The clerk was instructed i) to establish the position regarding possible expenditure by the Parish Council for the purpose of keeping the village tidy. This

matter had been raised at the Annual Parish Meeting and the Parish Councillors felt that it should be pursued.
 2) to establish whether or not the pathway from the shop to the church is defined as a 'pavement'. (This was in connection with the matter raised by Mr. Atkins concerning parking on the pavement.)

CEIS PITS. There was considerable discussion regarding this matter, both at the Ann. Parish Meeting and the Parish Council meeting. The clerk was instructed to request that further consideration be given to the question of cost of emptying cess pits in the village free of charge.

PLAY SPACE Mr. Dilley reported that Sir William Miles had given further thought to this matter and had agreed to consider the space at the rear of Mr. Blake's being used for this purpose, subject to the agreement of Mr. Blake and the Church's approval of use of the access through the churchyard. It was made clear that there would be no access via the Manor Drive.

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A.O.B. It was stated that the footpath between ~~cross~~
FOOTPATHS. ~~free~~ from Mr. Aowles' house and the lowe pair of the common was very weigour. It was agreed that the footpath be kept open and wide as it is the only right of way on to the common. It was decided that further action in this matter be left until the P. Council knew how much money would be available for this purpose.

Mr. Cole stated that, as an outcome of the Annual Parish Meeting, Mr. Aowles had offered to plant flowers, free of charge, beneath the tree in the centre of the village and around the tree opposite Rectory Farm.

After some discussion it was agreed that Mr. Cole be asked to thank Mr. Anderson, on behalf of the Parish Council, accepting his offer to plant flowers around the tree opposite Old Rectory Farm but delaying its decision regarding the ^{a have & required} Gross tree in order to seek permission to remove the sand. The Clerk was instructed to write to the District Council, in this connection.

WALTON-IN-CORDANO PARISH COUNCIL

At a meeting of the Parish Council held on Tuesday 13th August 1974.

PRESENT.

Messrs. A.J. Cole (Chairman) K. Dilley, R. Knight, GTH Russell and C. Dunn and the clerk Mrs. B.S. Cannell. Also present, in an advisory capacity, was Mr. G. Barker District Councillor. The minutes were read, confirmed and signed, by the Chairman Mr. A.J. Cole.

MATTERS ARISING

Fire-fighting demonstration. It was agreed that the demonstration had proved that the Fire Service could deal adequately with fires occurring in the upper part of the village, but some concern continued to be expressed regarding the use of water from the stream in the event of fires in the central area.

It was agreed that the clerk should write to the Fire Office expressing the Parish Council's appreciation in respect of the demonstration.

Responsibility for Walton Brook The clerk stated that, apart from an acknowledgement of her letter dated 22.6.74, she had received no further communication from the Wesser Water Authority, in this connection.

State of the Village

In connection with a letter to the Divisional Surveyor regarding this matter the clerk need a letter dated 3rd July 1974 in which the Divisional Surveyor explained that several Highway hedges had now been passed to the District Council (Woodstock). Mr. Lee (Director of Technical Services) had written in answer to the question of heds. for public footpath maintenance stating that no further heds could be made available this year.

Planting of Highway verge. Mr. Penn 23.7.74 stated

that he had no objection to the planting of flowers and general tidying of the area. He also stated that whilst the sign had been removed in the summer period he insisted that it must be replaced in the interests of road safety during the winter.

Footway The clerk had requested information regarding the official depiction of a pavements. Since it was considered that the answer was inadequate it was agreed that a further letter be sent regarding this matter.

In answer to a question concerning the proposed planting of flowers by Mr. Arche, Mr Cole stated that there had been no further development

Cess Pits A letter from Woodloving dated 28th June 1974 was read by the clerk. This explained that negotiations were in progress with a view to the Wessex Water Authority accepting responsibility for the cost of emptying cesspits. In the meanwhile, he explained, that the District Council is considering the rationalising of charges for this service.

Also in this connection and in reply to a letter from the Clerk passed to them by Avon C.C. a letter had been received from the Wessex Water Authority. This explained the basis of the "general service charge" and enclosed a photostat copy of a letter from discussion of the letter in the House of Commons on 2nd May 1974. Mr. Denis Howell (Sec. of State for Environment) stated that although no action could be taken this year efforts will, in time be made to "identify properties without main drainage and (as) make arrangements for limiting their charge accordingly."

There was some discussion about the current charge for cesspit emptying. Although it had been reported in the Press that it was proposed that the first emptying in each year should be free of charge Mr. Barker explained that this had not yet been ratified. The clerk was instructed to find out details of current charge.

PLAY SPACE Members of the Parish Council and the clerk had met at the proposed site for the play space to consider possible lay out, fencing etc. Mr. Cole welcomed Mr. Barker (District Councillor). He had agreed to give advice regarding possible financial help and procedures. He suggested that the best course was to precept for the required amount.

Mr Barker also recommended that the Parish Council should, in any case, precept for the full amount to which it was entitled. (Namely the amount which is the product of a penny rate.)

It was decided that the first priorities were to lease the ground and provide fencing. Mr. Dilley agreed to approach Sir William Miles initially to ascertain the type of fencing and positioning which he would consider most suitable. The clerk was requested to obtain lists of equipment etc.

However, in the event of the final decision being to include Tickerham the Parish Council wish it to be known that it feels very strongly that the six parishes thus combined should have three representatives on the District Council since they would be representing a population spread over a large area.

MINUTES

The minutes were read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS

ARISING

Walton Brook. The clerk read a letter from the Wessex Water Authority concerning responsibility for Walton Brook and the flow of water (15.8.74)

State of the Village

FOOTPATHS

The clerk read a letter from the District Surveyor purporting to depict 'pavement' and 'footway'. He stated that the question of brambles and briars was being investigated. The clerk was instructed to write again in this connection. (6.9.74.)

GULLIES

It was proposed by Mr. Dilley and seconded by Mr Cole that a letter be sent, regarding two gullies in the village. It was stated that two gullies, on the Coast road, twenty yards past Down Farm, on the opposite side of the road are completely blocked. This proposal was agreed.

The clerk was instructed to draw the Surveyor's attention of the Director of the facts that 1) Maurice's path had not been cut this year 2) there is a dangerous gap in the pavement directly opposite Chund Farm 3) information is required concerning the proposed fencing of Maurice's Path and 4) that overgrown shrubs and hedge, from the end of old Rectory Farm to the right of way at Sunnybank, continue to aeste a public nuisance.

CERS PITS

The clerk need a letter from the Director of Technical Services 10.9.74 stating that, although cers pit emptying charges were under review the current charge is still £1.00 per 1000 gallons.

The clerk need a letter from Wilks and Brown Trees Ltd giving details and fees for injection against Dutch elm disease. She also stated that she had received a telephone call from Mr Hillier, of the Planning Dept. informing her that the tree in question was infected by Dutch elm disease. The Planning Dept. were attempting to establish ownership of the tree but thought it belonged to Sir William Miles. A letter dated 4.10.74 confirmed this telephone conversation and noted that the consideration of a Tree Preservation order was therefore inappropriate.

The clerk stated that she had recently received a telephone call from Mr Travis (Parish Dept) concerning this matter. His department thought the tree belonged to the Parish Council and that no action could be taken until ownership had been established. He did not consider the tree to be a hazard in its present state.

It was proposed by Mr Cole and seconded by Mr Russell that a letter be sent to Sir William Miles asking if the elm tree in question belongs to him. This was agreed.

Mr Dilley reported that Sir William Miles had agreed to let the proposed space to the Parish Council for an initial two year period. It was agreed that chain link fencing would have to be erected 1) along the Manor drive 2) behind Mr Blake's property and 3) along the church boundary. Mr Dilley stated that the cost of providing such fencing through a Building Contractor would be approx £3.00 per metre. Mr Dilley agreed to provide a site plan for the Parish Council so that it could be presented to Sir William Miles. Further enquiries to be made - Avon L.C.A. Mr Hiddiford eh. Mr Cole (Chairman) proposed that the stream running through the village, from Church Farm to Old Rectory House be covered over as he considered that it presented a hazard to pedestrians in its present state. Mr Dilley seconded the motion. As Messrs Dilley and Knight sharply objected to the motion it was put to the vote. RESIGNATION OF CLERK

The clerk stated that, owing to the pressure of work in other spheres, she had reluctantly submitted her resignation to the Chairman. This was accepted and thanks were expressed to the clerk for her work for the P.C.

APPOINTMENT OF NEW CLERK

It was proposed by Mr. Cole and seconded by Mr. Dunn that Mrs. B. Atkins be asked to take over the work of the clerk. This motion was carried and it was agreed that Mrs. Atkins be invited to attend the next meeting of the Parish Council. Mrs. Cannell agreed to carry on in the time being and to give Mrs. Atkins all possible assistance.

Matters arising from Minutes.

PROPOSED

The clerk informed the Parish Council of her receipt of a petition against this proposal, which had been organised by Mrs. G. Gooding. (Mrs. Gooding was present at the meeting in the capacity as a representative of the public). The petition contained 83 signatures.

The clerk stated that she had received two letters from the Avon C.C. Divisional Surveyor regarding this matter. In reply to the Parish Council's letter the Surveyor stated that he would be prepared to cover over a pipe, the steam, but that as it belonged to Sir William

Miles his permission would have to be sought. In a subsequent letter he stated that Sir William was not in favour of the proposal and requested confirmation that the majority of the villagers were also opposed to the scheme.

After considerable discussion regarding this matter it was agreed by the P.C. that, in accord with the obvious wishes of parishioners the proposal should now be dropped.

CARAVAN

The clerk reported a telephone conversation with the Social Services Department regarding the caravan at rest on the Coast Road. The outcome of this conversation was very unsatisfactory. The Avon Playing Fields Association & The National Playing Fields Association for possible assistance towards the expense. As the proposed lease on the Play Area/ at the present, had been determined
