the Agenda :- Footpaths:- Mr H. Waygood has undertaken to cut them in good order again this year. It was specified that he does this at least twice, at a fee of £40. The Clerk was instructed to contact Mr Waygood, requesting that he cleared the footpaths, ~~& plant~~ the first priority, being the very overgrown footpath by the Church. All footpaths to be cleared at least by July 31<sup>st</sup>. The second clearance should be September - October. Mr Waygood was to be informed, that if he finds difficulty to complete this work at the correct times, he was to inform the Council. When enquiries would be made to find another suitable person.

Footpath signs:- It has been observed that a sign at the rear of Brighton Cottage & the sign leading to the Common. The Clerk was to inform the Dept.

Item 3.

Overgrown Verges:- At Walton Bay, the Coast Road & Mod Lane, causing a dangerous situation to pedestrians. This to be reported to the Dept.

Item 4.

It has been observed that in the lay by opposite the Signal Station, there are Plastic Bags containing Tins Bottles & Stones etc. This has been ignored by the collectors. The Department was to be informed.

Item 5 ✓

In spite of a previous inspection & Ban by the Health Dept, apparently Refuse & effluent has still been disposed of on to the foreshore, at the rear of (Ross's) Caravan Site. A request for inspection was to be forwarded to the Dept;

- Item 6. ✓ Mr Russell has received a request, from Mrs Wills, regarding the Plane-Tree at the front of the Manor. The request is that a Preservation Order be made to protect this tree.
- Item 7. ✓ In spite of numerous requests for repairs to the Coast Road. There are still very bad potholes in the vicinity of Saffron Lea & Mrs Pugsley's cottage. Another request for action was to be lodged to the Dept. A letter of thanks was to be forwarded to Mr Penn, thanking him for Phase 1 to the drains at Walton Bay, & a possible date for Phase II to be carried out. Unfortunately due to the recent tarmacing, in heavy rainfall, water is bypassing the Gullies. The Council suggest minor revisions to falls, all suggested that someone could inspect the site, in a heavy rainfall, to see exactly what happens. Apparently this situation is affecting Residents further up the road from Mr Rowles' property. This situation is causing him some embarrassment.

### Item 9

The Clerk was requested to leave the meeting, in order that the Councillors could discuss a revision regarding the Honorarium.

of one area of Moor Lane, (The first Bend)  
on which, after heavy rainfall, the water cannot drain  
away. The Clerk was instructed to contact Mr Penn,  
a suggestion to be proposed, the possibility of a  
gully to be cut into the bank. of the Brook.  
Other matters, to be reported to the appropriate  
Dept's: 1. The extreme urgency of some attention to  
the Coast Road, particularly the Pot Hole near  
"Sylvanlea".

2. Attention is required to the Coastal Footpaths, as  
it is considered a hazard in its present state.

3. The Public Footpaths signposts, which have already  
been reported, with a request for attention.

4. Sir William Miles was to be contacted, regarding  
some trees, which have Dutch Elm Disease.

5. The clearance of Footpaths was discussed. It was agreed,  
that a more permanent arrangement, regarding the  
maintenance was required. The possibility of advertising for  
a suitable person, was suggested. The Council decided to defer this matter, for  
review in 1978.

At a Meeting held in the Village Hall, on Tuesday  
14<sup>th</sup> January 1948.

- Present:- Full Council & Mr H. Riddiford (District Councillor).
- Matters Arising:- 1 The Deterioration of The Parish Notice Board. Councillor G. Rowles, was asked to attend to this item & report his findings to the next meeting.
- 2 The Parish Precept was set at £210 for 1948-49.
- 3 It was agreed that an advertisement be placed in the Clevedon Mercury, inviting applications for a person to undertake the clearance of the Parish Footpaths.
- 4 The Council were concerned regarding the Planning Applications applied for, by Mr Wills of The Manor House. The Council questioned the reason for requiring further garages to the property, considering that there are adequate garages existing. The major concern is:- that as the Manor is such a focal point in the village, any alterations to the existing area, be in keeping with the environment of the Parish. The Clerk was instructed to write to the Director of Planning, stating the Council's views. Mr H. Riddiford was requested to act on the Council's behalf.
- 5 It has been reported to the Council, that due to a planning application No. 3083/47 Hilltest Limited at Conygar Quarry Norton's Wood Lane, for a Scrap Yard. The Parish of Walton-in-Gordano is being affected, as large lorries carrying scrap cars etc. are using the Parish's roads to convey their loads to this quarry. This is very detrimental to our Parish. Mr H. Riddiford was requested to convey these objections on behalf of The Parish Council.
- 6 Councillor Rowles expressed his observations & concern for the area:- From the junction of Two Acres Walton Bay - to Nightingale Valley. Water still continues to remain on the the road. 2 There have been 3 accidents in the area of the Telephone Kiosk recently & he envisage many more. 3 The Traffic flow has & is still increasing at a very considerable rate. It appears that the whole of the Coast

Road is now a short cut to the M.5.  
 The community in the area is enlarging rapidly, plus  
 increasing number of vehicles.  
 In view of refusal by the Dept. for any traffic control,  
 a request was to be made to the Dept. for road  
 improvements, in this area. Councillor Rowles suggested  
 the removing of the Telephone Kiosk, as the present site  
 is a definite blind spot, plus being used by lorry  
 Drivers, Coaches & Buses, causing greater hazards.
